The Sixth Form at Solihull is a vibrant, inclusive and dynamic community that aims to foster intellectual curiosity and academic excellence. We seek to establish a lifelong love of learning and we work collaboratively to support our young people as they transition into early adulthood and life beyond.



Our academic provision encompasses 27 A Level subjects. This range of options ensures that our students can pursue their interests and passions. The structure of the academic day ensures students have regular access to subject specialists who have a true passion and level of expertise in their subjects, whilst also having time embedded to begin to nurture habits of independent study.

Each year we welcome approximately 40 new students to our cohort at the start of the Lower Sixth and with this being a key and popular transition point, it is an easy time to make friends and to establish themselves within a new peer group. We foster transition with small tutor groups and bespoke transition events. Our post-18 pathway supports transition from school into wider life; we ensure that all students are guided towards options and supported in making applications and preparing for life beyond A Level education.

Life at Solihull helps students to ensure that their development is truly holistic and that they enter adult life with a sense of 'all round' development. Our pastoral care sees tutors working with a small group of tutees and developing supportive coaching relationships. We also offer a breadth of co-curricular opportunities that allow our students to step into new challenges and new roles, as well as indulging further the passions and interests that have shaped their formative years.

We believe that sixth form education is the time for young people to learn through increasing independence and mounting resilience. It is a space for them to learn to advocate for themselves and to develop the necessary skills to become good communicators. If sixth form education is enjoyable then young adults become lifelong learners, equipped for our ever-changing society and global community.

The Cooper Building


The most recent addition to our Warwick Road campus is the impressive Cooper Building, designed to meet the needs of our Sixth Form students.

2 st century skills

At Solihull, we aim to inspire and encourage students to participate in life outside the classroom. We feel that the lessons they learn whilst experiencing these activities are as powerful as the lessons learnt in the academic arena.

Our co-curricular activities are categorised as Academic Enrichment, Community Relations, Music, Outdoor Education, Performing Arts (Dance and Drama) and Sport. There are over 80 clubs and societies to embrace, including Debating, Chess, the Equity Group or the Engineering Education Scheme.

Students in the Sixth Form are encouraged to instigate co-curricular opportunities; this helps them demonstrate leadership skills of being front-footed, flexible, grounded and giving. Their knowledge will be further enhanced by a weekly Enrichment and Wellbeing and Personal Development lesson, in addition to choosing accredited course options, such as the popular and extremely worthwhile Extended Project Qualification.

We hope our students leave Solihull with a passion for something new that will enrich their life, having had the opportunity to find their voice and challenge themselves along the way.
